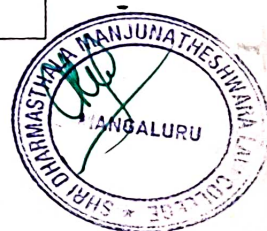

The inaugural function was held on 18 march 2023. It was hosted by Asst.Prof. Nelvita Noronha who welcomed all the gathered dignitaries and the participants of the conference whole heartedly. She then acknowledged the gracious presence of the esteemed guests, Hon. Mr. Justice. P. Krishna Bhat, former judge of high court of Karnataka; Prof. Dr. V. Vijaykumar, honourable vice chancellor of NLIU Bhopal; Prof. T. V. Kattimani, Honourable vice chancellor of Central Tribal University Andhrapradesh; Dr. C Basavaraju, Honourable Vice Chancellor KSLU Huballi; Dr G B Patil, Dean and Registrar of KSLU; Dr. Satish Chandra, Honourable secretary pf SDME Society Ujire and esteemed Principals of all organizing institutions of Mangaluru zone, Coordinators of the Conference, staff, management and students of various colleges who had gathered there for the formal program.

After welcoming all the members of the conference, student of SDMLC, performed a traditional welcome dance which mesmerized the audience and the dignitaries. Environmental education helps in building natural world. It gives knowledge and method to solve complex environmental issues. Sustainability is no more an option but a need of all. With this note the program was continued informing the participants that this conference would be a unique platform to share their insights for the magnification of law. He told about seeing divinity in everything referring to the recent film that was released in Kannada cinema industry (KANTHARA). towards the end of his talk he used few Sanskrit shlokas explaining the importance our ancestors gave to simple things and lived peacefully. He focused of increased participation of public in the matters of decision making and create awareness to the government and the sovereign body that opinion of public also matters and is essential to great extent for the growth of the society and country in whole.



After the address, a book by T V Kattimani was presented to all the dignitaries who were present. The program was then followed by the talk from each of the other dignitaries who were present on the Dias who shared their thought on the agenda of



the conference and why they felt it is important for young minds like ours to hear to the same. The overall agenda of the program was to create a self awareness among the students who can actually shape the world and detect the problems that is curbing the environment. SESSION 1

LOCAL SELF GOVERNMENT AND ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION

Resource Person: Prof. Dr. V. Vijaykumar, Vice- Chancellor, NLIU, Bhopal.

About Resource Person: Prof. Dr. V. Vijaykumar is the Vice- Chancellor of NLIU, Bhopal.

He started his session by saying “vasudhaiva kutumbakam” meaning “ for a truly enlightened person world is a family”. he further highlighted the fact that how much important of a role the local self government and environmental protection plays in making the world a family and that being the reason for him to choose the topic.

He began about the topic by telling about case between Canada and USA popularly known as Trail smelter case. It was a trans-boundary pollution case involving the federal govts of both Canada and the United States, which eventually contributed to establishing the harm principle in the environmental law of trans-boundary pollution. Smoke from the smelter caused damage to plant and soil in the surrounding area and also across the Canada USA border in the Washington.

He further informed us that in 1938 the tribunal ordered a payment of \$78,000 for the environmental degradation knowingly or unknowingly. He then told about 1972 Stockholm conference. The United Nations Environment Program was created as a result of this conference. He further continued by talking about the earth summit held in Rio De Janerio, Brazil, where they laid down the agenda 21, which had 40 different chapters. He particularly highlighted on chapter 28 which provides the legal framework that is required which is about the local self government. The final goal is improved management of chemical surface and it is estimated that 1/3<sup>rd</sup> of deaths in 3<sup>rd</sup> world countries is due to contaminated food and water. He further stressed on the point that women & youth should be part of decision making. He also noted paragraph 4 which states that an important goal would be to support, extend and



improve existing institutions working in the field of local authority and local environmental management.

He then talked about 73<sup>rd</sup> and 74<sup>th</sup> amendments made in 1992 which granted the Constitutional status to local self government in India. Maharashtra, Karnataka, West Bengal, Tamil Nadu maintained it. He also spoke about article 243 Z(d) and article 243 Z (e). Article 243 Z(d) clause I states that there shall be constituted in every state at district level a district planning committee. Article 243 Z (e) talks about Metropolitan planning committee. It also includes panchayat and metropolitan as well.

He also spoke about waste and beautifully mentioned how waste today is not a waste anymore and mentioned about waste segregation, waste to energy, waste recycling and waste to compost. He lastly mentioned about the coco cola incident.

He concluded the session by highlighting the fact that development should not damage the environment and the take home message being the role of global policy making on environment and its local implementation. He brought an end to a highly productive session by mentioning how much important of a role the educational institutions especially the law schools play in creating awareness among the young generation like us for protection of environment and how important it is to inculcate these values in the younger generation for the future of their younger generation.

### **Industrial Pollution and its impact on Environment Customary rights of tribes in India.**

Sir Kattimani.

1. Since 20yrs we speaking about saving tribes in India. Tribes centred in western ghats, or hills, malimahadeshvar betta,
2. Vacating the tribes from gr hills which declared has reserved forest. By authority
3. He explained the topic "customary rights of the tribe" by citing several story, here are some glimpse. Most of his presentation included narrative story.
4. He narrated a story of furious elephant that approached near him when he was in his study in the forest. When that furious musth approached the hut the man in the hut staired at elephant which returned back after getting aware that from man there is no treat. By this explained how tribes could control elephant.



5. He conveyed his message of bonding between wildlife and tribes by narrating a wonderful story yet again.

When white ruled us, there was an SP of Jabalpur who was given with the task of investigating the crime that happened inside the deep forest of Jabalpur. When he took up the task, he was accompanied by several tribal people, during the investigation, he encountered a tiger, which was coming near him, and out of fear tried to shoot it but declined that by the refusal of a tribal man who drew a line around the circumference, that tiger did not come out of line, it comes once that line was erased by same tribesman.

6. Temple management by a person appointed by the mahato of the village who would see all the rituals of the temple. that embraced the customary right of tribesmen.
7. Pattargadi andolan, Instruction stone installed in near the Entry Arch of the village.

That which highlights that without the permission of the village head, no administration official is permitted came to the village and many other instructions.

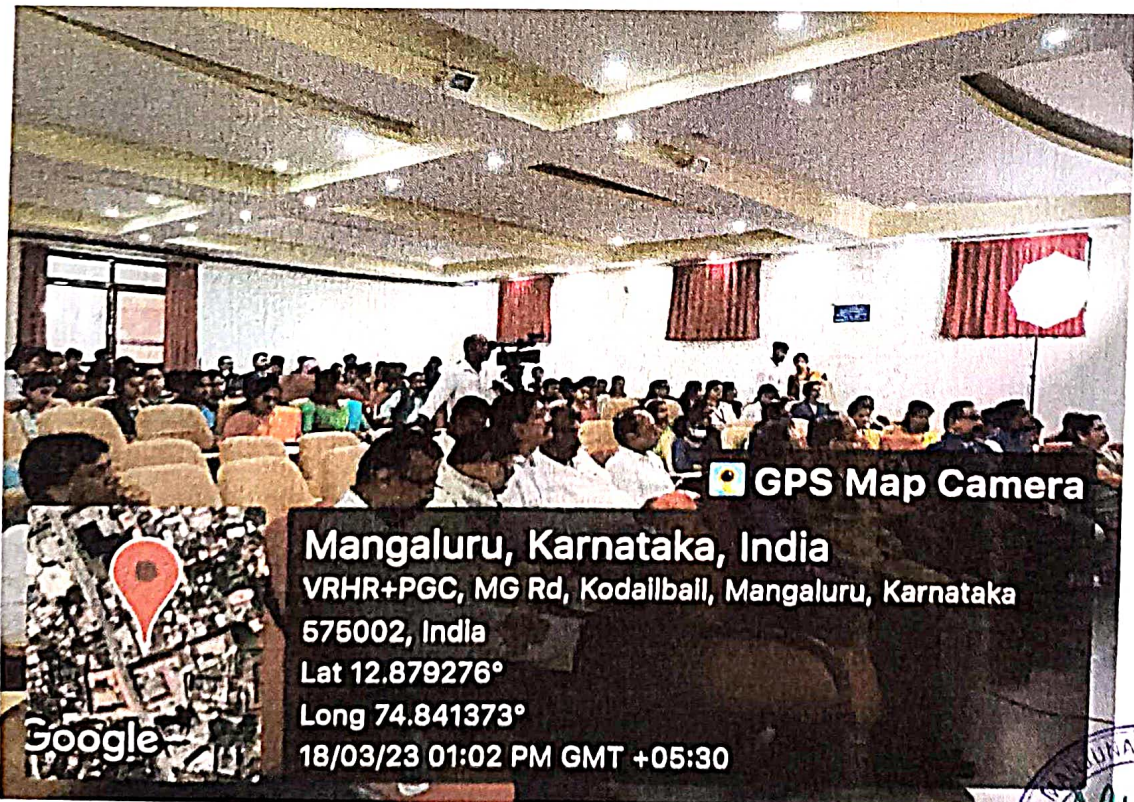
in Jharkhand state 14 districts and 11 districts in Andra customary law are applicable

kanyamathaye, here the girls of the tribal area, where taken for road work in national highway construction, some girls were impregnated by the contractor.

8. the babies born out of this bond were recognised by the village panchayat decision. here the well-known tribal ritual of breaking of martial bond by saying openly that she would not continue the relation with a married fellow. babies born out in tribes are recognized by moms' names, not the fathers.
9. If a boy or a girl wants to have a marital relationship with another gender, there is a customary right given to them, they can run away, or stay in the place reserved for such purpose in the village. parents and relatives from both sides would come to take both willing couples and get married.
10. Forest can only be saved by these tribes. they are real protectors their customary right would indirectly save our forest.







## SESSION 2

Resource Person; Prof. (Dr.) Dilshad Sheikh

### Key points

- The samples on Arctic/Antarctic region has given an alarm that pollution has entered into untouched areas.
- Industrial Pollution has gone above and beyond the boundaries imagined and is posing a serious threat that needs to be addressed
- A comprehensive integrated approach that focuses on
- Even though the principle of good governance exists ,the pollution has increased is due to the fact that there is no adherence to written law/legislations etc.
- Prevention of pollution is a alternate that is available to us instead of trying to make things normal after it has been polluted
- The main reason for Foreign Direct Investment is due to the lack of stringent laws in our country. These investment firms know that they will not face regulatory measures and have taken advantage of that.
- Though there is a need for FDI ,there has to be a regulatory mechanism to prevent exploitation of environment
- Dr dilshad sheikh raises an important question as to why we do not have a mechanism that deals with these industries before they are created. The remedy is made available once sufficient damage is done. Preventive mechanisms that save environment from the negative effects of Industries have to be created to minimize the problem

### Environmental Issues and Concerns : Judicial Perspectives

- He states that When it comes to environment everyone of us is a hypocrite.

That is the reality of Environmental issues and unless the Youth collectively decide to stand up and face this issue, nothing can stop this monumental problem



**SESSION 3**  
**ENVIRONMENTAL HEALTH AND STRENGTHENING RESILIENCE**  
**TO PANDEMICS**

Resource Person: Prof. Dr. Bismi Gopalkrishna, Professor and Dean, School of Indian Legal Thought, Mahatma Gandhi University, Kottayam.

About the Resource Person: Prof. Dr. Bismi Gopalkrishna is alumnus of United States department State Bureau and educational and cultural affair, professional exchange program, professional leadership program and has 25 years of experience as a teacher at Kannur university of Kerela and Mahatma Gandhi University. To add on she has four books written by her and 40 research papers and 9 students who have successfully completed their PhD under her guidance.

She began her session by highlighting the fact that we all have once faced pandemic and what we can do to equip ourselves to face the future battles. She later continued, by asking the gathering about what is resilience. To which she later answered that, it is something by which we can further prevent pandemics, stopping their spread if they do occur and minimizing the damage they cause. COVID 19 has made aware to the people all around the world to make strengthen ourselves in future pandemic emergencies.

Talking further she discussed about the short term policies that has been put forth by the government regarding health care system. She claimed that the society of health depends or is directly linked with environmental health and it is necessary for us to think about long term policies which can assure us safety. She added that we have to limit people to the exposure of physical, chemical and biological agents like soil, air, water so that we can reduce the vulnerability to future pandemics.

Later on she spoke about green recovery which acted as an eye opener which calls for environmental sustainable recovery. The 3 R's that is Response, Recovery and Re-



decide are now the building blocks of enhancing the resilience to the pandemic and other environmental emergencies. The triple R frame work talks about Response, that is addressing emergencies, like in-case of pandemic we had ensure about social distancing, use of sanitizers and in-case of environmental factor the growing issue on medical waste and other waste are also something we must consider.

Digitalization, in green infrastructure like the modern electric vehicles which we use, were also enlightened upon. Improving the air quality, improving the access to clean water, ensuring financial stability, addressing the waste generation management and also revisiting to the conservation of biodiversity were some of ideas for the policies which was put forth by the Professor.

While towards the end of her session she sparkled a thought of changing the world from economic system to eco-system. Sshe mentioned on what are the measures we have to take and consider in favour of saving our environment. We have to stop habitat destruction, we are ought to respect the wildlife and with this she concluded her session by enlightening several young minds who are the growing buds for the future.

### Changing dimensions of environmental jurisprudence

Dr shabeer Ali.

This session was headed by the chairperson,

He started his session by drawing everyone's attention toward mind-blowing questions.

1. When was environmental law gained more attention
2. Which kinds of fundamental rights will be violated if our environment is not protected well?
3. When will be the next eco day? And so on.

**The key highlight of his theoretical presentation is put as follows**

The protection of the environment is an old concept. It is evolved with time and so in the same way, environmental jurisprudence also evolved through time.

1. Environmental jurisprudence in ancient times.



1. People believed God created this planet and nature so this is our duty to safeguard it. In ancient times people used to pray the nature for their sustenance. Atharvaveda, the fourth Veda, speaks about the necessary protection required for environmental care. Trees are an abode of various kinds of gods. Sages and saints lived in the forest and protected the forest. We respect trees and females pray to the Tulasi plant daily to get positive vibrations. Varaha Purana mentions the planting of several types of trees would directly take us to a heavenly Abode.
2. Rig Veda, manusmrithi, Charaka Samhita, and many Upanishads have clearly laid the foundation for environmental jurisprudence in India.
2. Pre-historic period.
  1. Christian Baptised water has a purification source.
  2. while delivering his speech, he Reiterated Prof Vijayakumar's words that we are trustees of this planet earth.
  3. Buddhist condemned tree cutting and animal slaughtering
3. Historic period.
  1. Mauryan period was a glorious period to deal with environmental protection. Through their policies, they protected the forest.
  2. Worship of snakes in Naga Panchami reflected the love towards nature.
  3. Muslim rulers also protected the garden and made numerous policies and invention  
Shalimar garden and Moghul Garden are some examples.
4. British period.
 

British through their several policies captured the forest and utilized it as they wanted.

To make ships that sailed their goods through the sea. They coped millions of tons of timbers.

  5. IPC and many other policies like the smoke nuisance Act gave a new dimension to environmental jurisprudence.
  6. Water body pollution control boards are some statutory bodies and many other pollution control board protect our environment.

#### Technical session 4

Biodiversity -Threats,Conservation and need for legal protection

The session on the 19th was inaugurated amidst the dignitaries on the Dias and the welcome for the session was done by Asst.Prof.Tina.H.S of K.V.G Law College, Sullia . The chairperson for the following session was Prof.Dr.V.Sudesh who welcomed the speakers for the session and further the chairperson was also felicitated by the Principal of K.V.G Law College.

The panel of speakers were Dr.K.R.Chandrashekhar and Dr.Girish

The first half of the session was taken up by Prof.Dr.K.R.Chandrashekhar who began his session with a shloka remembering all the goddesses and tulsi matha where he speaks about the connection we feel with nature while chanting the same . He also reminded everyone listening to him that human beings are nothing without plants.

He spoke about how organisms in the environment are divided into Biotic and abiotic living beings. He mainly divided his session into 3 parts : Diversity , Threats and Conservation

The earth being 4.6 million year old and having different forms of life existing on it the speaker asked his audience as to what role did we play in the genesis of earth? And also in the origin of earth. The important of plants as well as the value of trees for which the humans destroy it was also highlighted.

Talking further he discussed about the various pollution that is degrading the environment i.e water pollution, air pollution, atmospheric pollution, marine pollution, thermal pollution, land pollution, and also how hazardous is the industrial waste which causes a lot of damage to marine life. He further spoke about how humans in the present times have started encroaching the land of the wild which indeed is considered as a main cause for the imbalance in nature and due to this





human greed there is a degradation of the environment causing damage to Mother Earth.

Later on he spoke about the traditional plant conservation method and it's mainly divided into In-situ and Ex-situ method where mainly In-situ conservation is a protected area network and Ex-situ conservation is a process of protecting endangered species or breeds of either plants or animal outside their natural habitat. Pilikula nisargadhama was the place mentioned by the speaker where he had conducted various activities relating to conservation of plant as well as animal varieties.

While towards the end of his session he enlightened his listeners by saying that "Environment is not just for me or you but it belongs to everyone, we must make use of it but in a sustainable manner". He also stressed upon the fact that youngsters, students are the ones who should create awareness among others as well as themselves to conserve environment. The session by Prof.Dr.K.R Chandrashekhar left us pondering when he made a statement saying that "We will not exist without the earth but the earth can definitely sustain without us"

#### Environmental effects of Illicit drug production

The second half of the technical session was continued by Dr.Girish Kumar who spoke about "Menace of Drug Abuse". He discussed the various reasons for drug abuse and the main issue pointed out by him was the absence of parental care which leads to the consumption of drugs by youngsters. Secondly due to the decline of religious values, as generation changes the values carried on since age old slowly starts diminishing and is considered as outdated by the present generation. And also mainly due to the process of industrialisation, urbanisation where he said because of all this it led to the loosening of social control in the society. The speaker



mentioned it clearly that when the demand for drugs increases automatically the production also increases.

Moving further into the topic he gave a classification of the Illicit drugs , where it is mainly divided into three types:

Natural drugs: opium, cannabis, coca

Semi-synthetic drugs: where natural drugs are treated with chemicals Ex: Morphine, heroin

Synthetic drugs: LSD

He also clearly mentioned that all these types of drugs have detrimental affect on the environment such as Toxification, Water depletion, Deforestation, Toxic waste pollution, Biodiversity loss; these are the very few affects that drugs cause to our environment. The speaker dealt with each of the problem talking about how it actually affects the environment and it was completely a new information gained by the spectators.

Toxification is a process where due to certain drugs the molecules present in the soil or water turn toxic which henceforth leads to damage to the environment. He brought into light how the endosulfan had affected the foetus in the mothers womb which resulted in stunted growth of children. The main problem caused by production of drugs is water depletion, the speaker here clearly stated that around 30-40 litres of water is required to water the plants used in preparing the drugs. Further he discussed about the worldwide issue of every place deforestation where he said that due to deforestation there is emission of carbon and has main effects such as Barren soil, Habitat loss, Earths natural balance is affected. By the information given by the speaker about how drugs abuse could affect the environment everyone where left in thoughts.

Further he covered various International Conventions which help in controlling drug abuse all over the world; The UN Convention on Narcotic Drugs 1961 it is considered as a universal system of drug control and he also mentioned the 1971 Convention of Psychotropic Substances. Various constitutional provisions were also discussed which



help protect the environment as it is considered as a fundamental duty of every citizen. Article 48A, Article 51A(g), Article 253 and Article 47 were covered in this session In detail by the speaker.

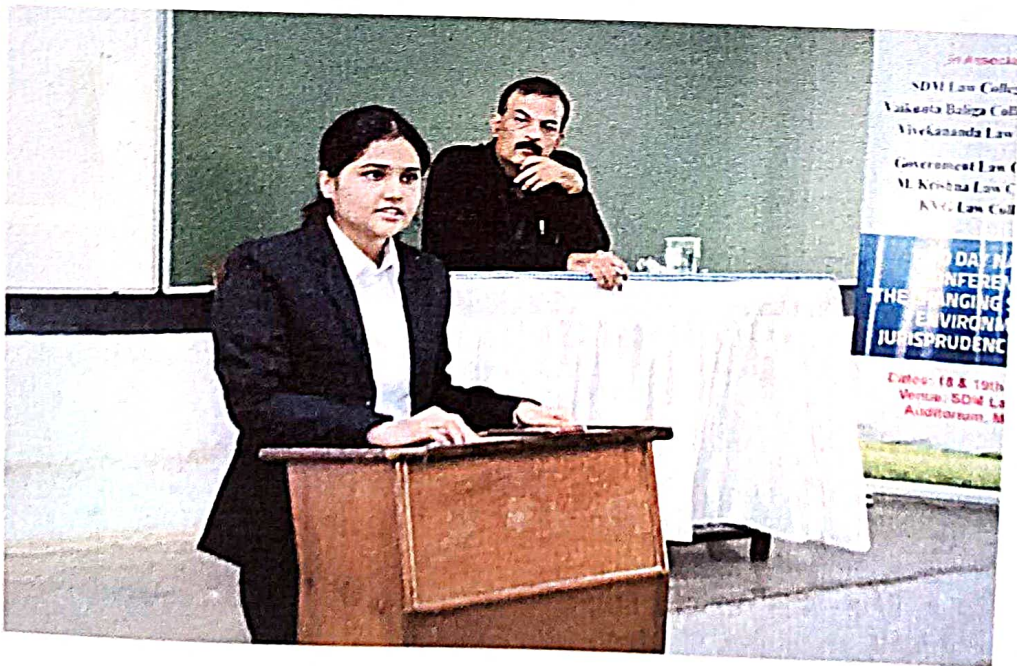

There was parallel paper presentation sessions both in online and offline mode. Total 58 research papers were presented.





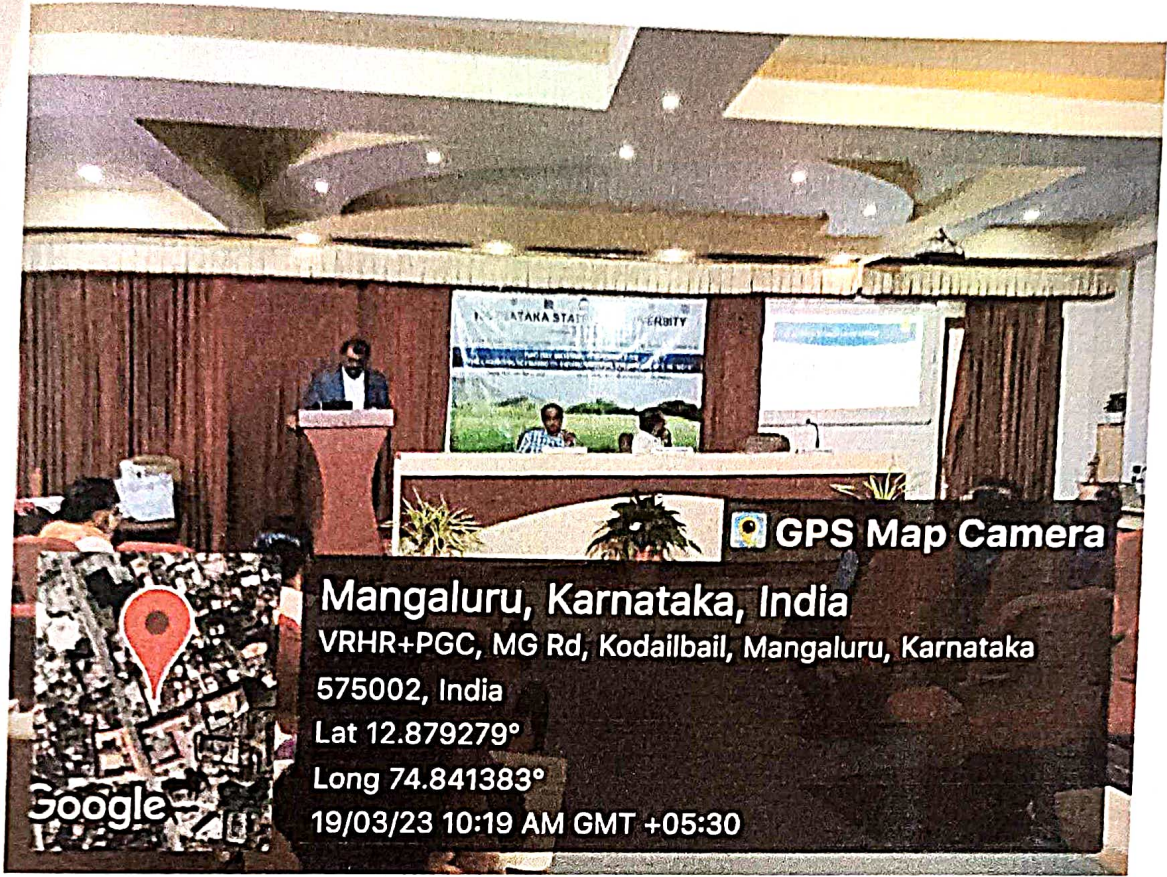
### Valedictory Session

# 'Nature should have same rights as humans, animals'

Two-day conference on 'The changing scenario of environmental jurisprudence' begins at SDM Law College

The Hindu Bureau MANGALURU

Like human beings and animals, nature should get the status of a legal person and its rights should be protected, said former Karnataka High Court Judge P Krishna Bhat here on Saturday. Speaking after inaugurating the two-day conference on 'The changing scenario of environmental jurisprudence' at SDM Law College, Mr Bhat said the founding fathers of the Indian Constitution did not foresee that the environment was going to be damaged extensively. "Article 21 (protection of life and personal liberty) cannot be expanded further. We are unable to get realistic solutions (the protection of environment)," he said. Expressing the need for giving a legal framework to make environment protection more effective, Mr Bhat referred to the Constitution of Chile that provides for restrictions on certain activities for protecting the environment. Ecuador's Constitution states that nature has integral rights to exist and her maintenance should be respected. "In India we do not have this," the former HC Judge said and added, "Like Human Rights Protection Act and Wildlife Protection Act, the same kinds of rights should be enacted for the protection of nature and these rights must be enforceable. Like the way a duty is considered as a legal person, there should be legal framework to consider nature as a legal person and its rights should be protected," he said. Our forefathers,

he said, were very much aware of the need for a fine balance between developmental needs and environment protection. "We have violated all that and are facing problems," he said and added, "We should not push the earth to extinction."

T V Kattimani, Vice-Chancellor of Central Tribal University, said that there was an effective legal intervention to deal with waste generated by industries. V. Vijaykumar, Vice-Chancellor of National Law Institute University, Bhopal, welcomed efforts of Karnataka State Law University (KSLU) to involve a cluster of educational institutions in an environment awareness campaign.
