Inaugural address

Mrs. Shyamala S Kundar, Member, National Women's Commission, delivered the Inaugural address. In her address she highlighted the role of women, the position and the kind of respect given to women in India and she was of the opinion that, even though women play a major role in the upliftment of both family and society, they are not given equal treatment on par with men, and they are not considered to be in equal status to men. She opined that, today more and more women are coming out from the clutches of patriarchy and are dominating various fields in the society through their achievements and she encouraged more and more women to take up initiatives and come up in life and not to shelve themselves. Finally, she urged that, women must familiarize themselves with the laws that provide her protection and secure her life but at the same time they should not indulge in misusing the laws meant for their protection.





Keynote Address

Dr. Shashikala Gurupur, Director, Symbiosis Law School, Pune and Dean Symbiosis International, Awardee of the prestigious Kitturu Chennamma Award delivered the keynote address. Highlighting the role of women in society and their contributions in the development of society she went on to say that women though is pivotal for the development of society, is not given significant respect and importance and is forced to face a lot of gender injustice in every walk of life and she went on highlighting the atrocities and crimes committed against women specially in the household setup. She also stressed that, when a women's Movement is threatened, the fundamental rights are also being threatened. She opined that, there are various research opportunities in the area of Gender Justice and more and more research has to be conducted in this area, and law has to be used as an instrument to challenge the culture to curb injustice, as according to her "Culture" is a major growing factor for Gender Injustice.

She opined that, women are Superior in terms of evolution, but the Sociological processes made the women to be of a weaker being. She stressed on the cultural dimensions and gave an analysis of gender index in Karnataka and went on to speak about the higher ratios in Kerala as Kerala followed 'Marumakkathayam'. She also spoke about how opportunities are ingrained in children of certain communities. She also quoted the 'Jayamala Committee Report' which reported that, 5 districts in Maharashtra Border as catchment area for female sex workers. She said that even today in Maharashtra one can still find the practices like female feticide and infanticide and that the male:

female ratio is comparatively low as compared to other states.

Speaking on the atrocities on women, she opined that, 'Technology' itself has to be used as a tool to curb Cyber Crimes against women, especially pornographic sites and Article 19 and Article 19(2) can be used in this framework to curb the crimes against women. She felt that, violence against women was one of the major crimes against women and it was a major roadblock in attaining the Sustainable Development Goals. She also opined that, the major factor of worry was the intimate violence i.e. violence faced by the women in trusted places like home, schools, offices etc. She stressed that children are to be given priority and safeguarding them becomes a necessity as according to her, the problem of intimate violence are often neglected due to two reasons:

- Whatever happens in the home is to stay there.
- De-humanizing the private life/Patriarchy.

She said that, CEDAW has compelled that Justice is to be brought within institutional setup for women. She also shared her experience on handling cases and explained how public patriarchy is over private patriarchy in crimes against women. According to her, intervention cannot be done alone with the help of law, but along with the help of NGO's and proper strategies. She opined that women should use law as a shield.

According to her, Section 498A and Prevention of Domestic violence Act is being misused in our System. She says that preventive mechanism is far from satisfactory and the Protection of Children from Sexual Offences Act (POCSO) has to be implemented effectively in accordance with the principles of natural justices. She also hinted on subtle sexism, body bias, expression bias etc.

With a concluding note she said that, creating an ecosystem where a woman is not vulnerable to crime has to be made to make a 'Crime Free India' especially with regards to crimes against women.

She also stressed that creating a para-Legal training with NGO's is also a necessity and she highlighted the Manodhairya Scheme and NALSA Scheme. She also opined that; the mental health dimensions should also be used along with punishments for the survivors.

Time was allotted for audience and participants to ask questions to the keynote Speaker Dr. Shashikala Gurupur and Mrs. Shyamala S. Kundar, member, National Women's Commission.

Dr. Ananth Prabhu G. was born on 03/10/1985. He is qualified in various field of Computer Science. He did his Bachelor in Engineering, Masters of Technology, Masters in Administration Information Science, Diploma in Cyber Law, and Doctor of Philosophy in Computer Science. His areas of interest are Cyber Crime Investigation and Cyber Law. He has conducted more than 1000+workshops in different areas related to Cyber Crime Investigation and Cyber Law. He has served as guest faculty in Cyber Law in Karnataka State Judicial Academy. He is a regular guest faculty since 2012 at Karnataka Police Academy, Police Training College, Bulgaria, Mangalore City Police.

Prof. B. S. Reddy has a wide teaching experience of 34 years and served as Registrar Evaluation at Karnataka State Law University, Hubballi in the year 2013. He has also held various positions in

different capacities in different prestigious institutions. He is also the Chairman, P.G Department of Law and Research, Kuvempu University, Shivmogga, and currently he is working as Principal, R L Law College, Davanagere.

Dr. Ananth Prabhu expressing his concerns towards growing hacking culture said that "Hacking is the New Norm"- 95% of 600 fortune Company are compromised and the other 5% doesn't know that they are compromised. He mentioned a list of chat applications that are safe. He opined that, there are no devices that cannot be hacked and he enlightened the audience about applications like PicMap and on various ways by which people/public are being cheated on websites and applications. He also spoke about outlet Malware attack. He also spoke about IDN -Homograph attack. And he opined that the only solution for cybercrimes is to resort to online shopping through application and not websites. He also spoke about snopes.com, world's No.1 fact checking website. He also enlightened about Stenography and how the government snoops on its people using the software 'Pegasus'. He spoke about various sites and to mention a few, he said that, 'have I been pawned', website tells us that if our emails have been hacked or not, 'www.cybersafegirl.com' tells about 25 common crimes against women. He also stressed on 'Deep Face' a new Technology that is used to change or morph photos and also spoke about 'Juice Jacking' which is an attack which enables people to download data from one's phone when a person connects something like a data cable to one's phone in public charging stations. Finally, he spoke about 'Secure Erase' an application that does Military Grade erasing on phone and once done, one will not be able to retrieve data from the phone.

The Chairperson, Prof. B. S. Reddy started his remark by elevating Dr. Ananth Prabhu's lecture into a Legal Perspective. According to him, if a girl does not know about technology, she is not safe. He thinks that it is important for law students and lawyers to know about the contributions made by other disciplines in the dispensation of justice.

About Resource Person

Mr. Sharath M.D. has assisted and investigated various important multi-level marketing scams-like ViniVinc Case, Rice Scam, Food for work Scam, various Cases of Murders, rape, dacoit and other sensational and heinous cases using Computer Forensics. In his official capacity, he has suggested various Data Security Methods to various reputed Companies in Bangalore. As a Faculty NASSOMS sponsored Cyber Lab in Bangalore, he has trained many police personnel's, bank officials, military forces, judges and software engineers in handling digital evidence and investigation techniques in Cyber Crimes. He was awarded "The Best Investigator in Cyber Crime for the years 2006-07 and 2009-10".

His Session was based on his experience and according to him Cyber Crune happens due to

negligence of the victims and he said that, there can be cases where our personal information can also be used as private entities have access to the information obtained from cookie tracking policy. He also said that phishing sites also pose a threat to the public, as using phishing sites the hacker can get access to some of the information's which can be used to target the victim, right from getting one's card details to other personal information's. He said that, Bangalore City Cyber Police Station had registered about 10,000 F.I.R in the past 3 months.

Dr Balika, Vice Principal, SDM Law College. She has 23 years of teaching experience, she has about five publications to her credits and two publications in reputed journals. She has been a resource person at various National and International Conferences/ Seminars and training programs. She has also delivered various lectures on varied themes and subjects at different institutions. She has also guided around 43 students in their LLM dissertation. She is also a regular trainer at District Training Centre, Mangaluru, on Women and Child related Legislations.

She began her talk by highlighting the development of technologies day by day and the impact that it creates on the society and at the same time, these technologies sometimes pose a serious threat not only for the society but for the users also, that is to say, with advancing technological developments, the threat of destroying evidences, manipulating evidences, creating fake evidences have been on the rise, and all these could impact the investigation process and could impact the judicial system in itself. She said that, one can observe that, there is a lag between technological development and the awareness of the investigating authorities on dealing with these technological aspects, and hence there is a necessity to educate and train the investigating authorities in the advancing technological aspects so that they are in a better position to handle such cases and also be in a position to act in advance so that the threat or damage could be minimized and it could thus help in better implementation of laws and also ensures justice to the victims.

About resource persons:

Dr. Rita Noronha, Director, Center for Development Studies and Education (CDESE) Mangaluru. started her paper with the theme, "Challenges Faced by Women in Public Life", wherein She said that, women belong to different social categories and the public life and private life can only be theoretical as private life and public life blends with each other. She also pointed out that, the challenges faced by women in public life may differ from women in one social category to another.

According to her one of the predominant challenges are sustained invisibility and social exclusion of women in decision making or leadership roles and also demographic challenge of missing women (declining number of women over the years.)

She was of the opinion that, women do not still have equitable access to resources and opportunities. They face violence in the public space (also in private space). There is an increase in the incidence of mental illness among women and men, like stress /hypertension/depression or suicides or addictions and she feel that women face the worst consequence of increasing incidence of Mental Health as women carry much higher proportion of work burden which affects their mental and physical wellbeing. She also said that, Women also face economic challenges like insecurity of work, persistent discrimination of wages etc. She felt that Inadequacy of the formal education was one of the reasons for the stereotypical gender bias.

Continuing with the talk she opined that another major challenge faced by women was sustained and extended restraints on rights and freedoms of women and not receiving adequate legal educational development and centric interventions are another kind of challenge faced by women. Gender bias can be seen as a force in the society inherited through the cultural messages and she emissted on 'Rape Culture', and said that, the rape culture does not only include the person who rape, but also those who justify rape and also those who are silent on sexual assault. She felt that women are also challenged on developing critical perspectives on patriarchal relations of power as she said that patriarchal power operates through culture, works through institutions and creates a mindset.

She felt that, gender discrimination also affects men negatively and challenges like strengthening the process of making a gender just society, upholding alternative gender justice models etc. are required so as to make a crime free society. The major challenge according to her is to promote sustainable, human development wellbeing of men and women for peace and harmony.

The chairperson, Dr. Satish Gowda N. Faculty of Law and NSS Programme Co-ordinator, P.G. Department of Studies and Research in Law and University Law College, Bangalore University, Bengaluru started his talk by congratulating the organizers of the conference and he urged the participants to think if deterrent punishment decreases the crimes. He opined that, the best institution to minimize violence was family, as Mind-set of an individual mattered. He said that, women do not participate in democracy due to lack of information and due to lack of quality education and hence there is a lag in quality of democracy. He emphasized on the role of teachers, family, elders and others in molding an enlightening society

About Resource Persons

The resource person of the session Mrs.Shruthi N.S, is currently the additional S.P of Chikkamagaluru district. She has done her M.Sc. in Agriculture. Shehails from Kodagu district in Karnataka.

The chairperson Dr.Maruthi T.R is the Associate professor in the department of Study Centre, University of Mysore. He is qualified in M.AL.L.M and Ph.D. from University of Mysore. He has guided 40 PhD candidates and he has published 80 papers in his name. He has presented around 130 papers in various conferences and seminars for the past 17 years. He has been researching and teaching in International Law. His area of speculation is International Law and Lawson.

Ms. Shruthi N.S started her lecture by introducing her theme and she said that that the analysis of witness must be recorded. She said that if there is a delay in registration of FIR it comes in way of authentic medical evidence. Speaking about the victim compensation scheme, she said that one application has to be given by the victim, but the money will be released only after the trial gets completed; she continued saying that the victim's services agency will not contact the victims by themselves and she further stated that according to Indian Evidence Act, in women related cases the past history of women should not be questioned.

She also quoted the Aruna shanbaug case to show how the executive body goes down to political pressure. She opined that cognizable offence doesn't get regulated and the locus standi of the complainant is questioned. She spoke about Zero F.I.R which delays investigation and she said that a case and the counter case should be investigated by one police officer, but in the court, it is not tried by the same prosecutor.

According to her, police officers in the police station can make or break the case. She explained about various crimes against women like honor killing, trafficking, female infanticides, acid attack and other such heinous crimes. She also pointed out how raising a girl child is both a pleasure as well as responsibility. Finally, she also spoke on various challenges faced by the police department in investigating and delivering justice in time and she also highlighted how the police department implements the various provisions of Criminal Procedure Code in their day to day functioning and administration of Justice.

The chairperson Dr. Maruthi T.R spoke on how the Civil Society has contributed to the increasing crimes against women. He also spoke on how contemning and humanity should go hand in hand. He also threw an insight on how violence starts at home and also quoted NCRB report. He also opined that the outdated education system is being another reason in increasing crimes. He said that, various philosophics have taught us on how to keep our ego aside and this has also enshrined in our Constitution by the words of Equality before law and Equal protection before law. He also felt that existing legislations are enough and there was no need for legislature to implement new laws. He urged the audience to formulate an action plan to help in countering the crimes against women and he felt that the entire society should be a part of this action plan. He also spoke about how culture plays an important role in the increasing number of crimes and cultural change can be used as a tool against the same problem. He quoted the statistics

Justice A.V Chandrashekar



Justice A.V Chandrashekar delivered the valedictory address. He opined that crimes need not be restricted to violence or rape only. He quoted the quote/shloka that where 'Women are happy, Gods are happy' he said that, the two main Wings of the state in implementation of justice are executive and Judiciary. He opined that burdening of the courts with cases are one of the reasons why there is a delay in administration of justice and he felt that, the justice to the victim should be given with the transparent trial; and not delayed and certainly not hurried. He said that, these days, the scope of victim is enlarged and has a right to file a case, even if the state failed to file a case and he continued saying that if the compensation awarded to the victim is not adequate, district legal services are bound to compensate the victim appropriately. Rule is to compensate and exception is to reject. He also spoke about Disha Bill being introduced in Andhra Pradesh. Disha Bill, 2019 provides for death sentence for offences of rape and gang rape.

He said that, the judicial system can help in minimizing the crimes by speedy trial without compromising on the witness dignity that is by creating a witness friendly environment in the courts. He emphasized on the duty of the Judges, Lawyers, Prosecutors, to the witnesses especially women Witnesses and children. He also spoke about the measures taken by the Karnataka Judicial Academy in sensitizing Judges towards witness. And he also stressed on how important it is to keep the dignity, integrity and sanctity of women.

Presidential address was delivered by Prof. P. Ishwara Bhat. He said that, there is a need for a systematic record to minimize the number of heinous crimes committed against women. He spoke on two types of crimes —

- 1) Crimes committed within the family.
- 2) Crimes committed outside the family.

He said that the rate of charge sheeting is 25% while the rate of acquittal is 15%. He also highlighted that, the part played by public opinion in influencing law makers and spoke about how our legal system has made provisions for combating exploitation faced by women. He also spoke about the various experiences faced by him in courts.

After due deliberations following are the recommendations suggested by the resource person:

LOCAL GOVERNMENT LEVEL

- 1. Women to take initiative beyond family norms.
- 2. Wemen related laws should not be misused
- 3. Cultural disparities towards women should be eliminated.
- 4. Women facing violence in trusted places should be the area of concern.
- 5. NGO's shall play crucial role in creating awareness.
- Missase of Domestic Violence Act is happening. To curb this thorough inquiry investigation should be conducted by the police officer immediately after happening of the incident.
- 7. In victim compensation the District Legal Service Authority shall play a crucial role.

STATE-GOVERNEMENT LEVEL

- 1. Women Commission shall be proactive.
- 2. Laws relating to women on household need to be relooked.
- 3. Sustainable development requires crimes against women be mitigated.
- 4. POCSO Act to be implemented strictly.
- 5. Creating eco system where women are not vulnerable to crime is the need of the hour.
- Workshop to be conducted on women related laws for NGO's/women organisations frequently at all levels.
- 7. Government should provide funds to conduct research on women related issues.

CENTRAL GOVERNMENT LEVEL

- 1. Gender injustice laws to be done away.
- 2. Research opportunities in the area of gender justice to increase.
- 3. Laws dealing with female foeticide, infanticide shall be strict.
- 4. Male and female ratio declining. It needs to be looked into.
- 5. Technology shall be used to prevent Cyber Crimes.
- 6. Para legal training for NGO is very necessary.
- 7. Education for all women necessary.
- 8. To create awareness among student community about cyber crimes, awareness programmes in schools and colleges should be organised.
- 9. Courts should adopt women friendly approach.
- 10. More and more computer forensic experts should be recruited in the investigating department for investigating cyber crimes and frequent training programme should be organised for police officials to update them with respect to latest trends in technology.
