

The majority of students (92%) found the classroom environment conducive to learning and discussion, indicating a positive and engaging space.


Are the recommended textbooks and course materials relevant and up-to-date for your studies?



Almost all students find the textbooks and course recommended materials 86% very relevant and up-to-date, while only 14% disagree.


Were the course objectives and learning outcomes in Syllabus achievable?


92% percent of the students found that the course objectives and learning outcomes were achievable; thus, the syllabus was well-structured. Only 8% said that the objectives were not achievable.






Did you find the course materials and resources in the library (books, journals, online resources) adequate for your academic needs?







Are the curriculum and course materials relevant and up-to-date to educate students for legal profession?






Do you find the student assessment and evaluation methods effective in measuring student learning outcomes?


Do you feel that the curriculum is flexible enough to accommodate different learning styles and needs?








The faculty was together in its opinion; 14 out of 14 felt that the relevance of such guest lectures and industry interface to students enhances their learning potential.

Do you find the Syllabus is well-structured to facilitate a smooth transition from one level to another from 1st year to final year legal course?








Are the students encouraged to participate in co-curricular activities and develop their leadership skills?








Feedback Analysis Alumni 2023 -2024


Did you feel that the curriculum was well-structured and aligned with your career goals?




Did you find the college library to be well-stocked and well-maintained?





Did you find the library staff to be helpful and responsive to your needs?





Were there sufficient opportunities for extracurricular activities and student organizations?




According to the alumni feedback, 53 / 58 showed sufficient opportunities for extracurricular activities and student organizations, indicating a very high level of satisfaction.

Did you feel that curricular and co-curricular activities helped to enhance your learning experience and personal development?




According to the alumni feedback, while most of them (54) felt that both the curricular and co-curricular programs had a positive effect on their process of learning and development, 4 of them disagreed.

The academic standards and evaluation, according to the responses of 56 / 58 alumni, were quite fair and reasonable.



Any other suggessions

Practical training: The alums have asserted that there is a need for practical training, which includes moot court sessions, court visits, and internships to expose the students to grassroots situations on the ground.

Curriculum Update: Alumnii suggested that there should be a regular updating of the curriculum, in keeping with the changes in laws and rules, and including new subjects and topics of relevance to the profession.

Improved job prospects: Respondents from the alumni expressed the need for more emphasis on clinical learning and internships in order to attain better job prospects.

Increasing participation in moot court: The suggestions provided by the alumni were to make participation in moot court sessions compulsory and increasing the number of sessions. Invite guest lectures: The alumni suggested that practicing advocates should be invited for guest lectures to provide an industry-institution interface for better understanding of the practical fields.

Pressure on university: The alumni called upon the university administration to undertake pressing upon the government for changing the subjects and removing repealed laws from the curriculum.

The alumni feedback brings to the fore the fact that practical training, updating of the syllabus, and emphasis on clinical learning and internships is necessary so that a student can be groomed towards a successful career in the field of law.




Analysis Parents Feedback 2023 - 24

Do you regularly meet class mentor, Student Welfare Officer, Principal?




Do you think that grievances of the students are properly addressed?




